VHC is pleased to present 'Waypoint', a solo exhibition of Iranian artist Farbod Elkaei.


Primarily working with oil and acrylic as his mediums, Farbood Elkaei treads between the definite and the intuitive as he distills naturally occurring forms into abstract geometric compositions. In his artworks, colourful papers are cut and superimposed over amorphously painted landscapes, clouds, mountains and skies, to produce a contemplative dialogue between the seen and the imagined.

The selected body of work, created between 2019 and 2021, marks a significant turning point in Elkaei's practice where he consciously moved away from a focus on outcomes towards a space guided by instinct and playfulness, as colours, texture and form became his tools for exploration. In earlier works, nature was depicted from a distance – vast, open, and observational. Here, however, the compositions became more intimate, abstract and emotionally resonant.

A key influence on this shift was "An Album of Artists' Drawings" from Qajar Iran - a collection of anonymous student sketches from the 19th and 20th centuries, each framed within richly detailed, decorative borders. Inspired, he began creating small - scale works on cardboard, embedding layered, vivid frames into the compositions.

These frames – referencing the tradition of miniature painting while rendered in abstract form - became metaphors for intimacy and structure, both at once containing and revealing. For Elkaei, they functioned as "windows" into moments of vulnerability, contemplation, and spontaneity.


This series- encompassing collages and framed abstractions - offered the artist a more liberated mode of working, away from the constraints of large - scale canvases. It marked a return to painting with a renewed vision; a perspective shaped by tradition yet unbound by it. What emerged was therefore a more personal and layered approach - a new direction in the artist's evolving practice.







Untitled , 2018 Acrylic, Oil, Canvas 177 x 79 cm (69.5 x 31 in)





Untitled , 2019 Acrylic, Canvas 79.5 x 65 cm (31 x 25.5 in)











Panjare 12, 2020 Acrylic, Canvas 108 x 84.5 cm (42.5 x 33 in)















Panjare 13, 2020 Acrylic, Canvas 74 x 52.5 cm (29 x 20.5 in)






Panjare 14, 2020 Acrylic, Canvas 78 x 52.5 cm (30.5 x 20.5 in)













Panjare 5, 2019 Acrylic, Cardboard 49 x 34 cm (19 x 13.5 in)




Panjare 8, 2019 Acrylic, Cardboard 49 x 34 cm (19 x 13.5 in)

Farbod Elkaei, born in 1992 in Tehran, Iran, is a conceptual artist, who received his BFA from Soore Art University in Iran. Elkaei's art practice involves sociallythemed projects, based on contemporary communal experiences. His paintings and sculptures juxtaposed natural landscapes, mainly mountain ranges, with colourful geometric scenes. Inspired by forms and colours that he observes in the skies, his artworks explore the unique relationship between colours, nature and geometry. Farbod Elkaei's recent solo exhibitions include Plus Porche at Philippe ES Gallery, France in 2025; Double Take at Hamzianpour and Kia Gallery, Los Angeles in 2023; Livelier in 2024 and Here, We Can Stay For A While in 2020, both held at Dastan's Basement Gallery in Tehran. His work has also been featured in several group exhibitions, such as Another Birth at Mine Gallery, Dubai in 2023; Prospect 2 at Parallel Circuit, Tehran in 2023; Nature of Things at Plus 2, Tehran in 2021; a group show at 1x1 Gallery, Dubai in 2018; Fluorescent at Iranshahr Art Gallery, Tehran in 2017; and a group show at Assar Art Gallery, Tehran in 2016, among others. Elkaei also participated in "The Wave" at the 12th Tehran Ceramic Biennial which was curated by Bita Fayyazi at Niavaran Cultural Center, Tehran in 2024.
