KHOSROW HASSANZADEH

Continuing on his older works that looked at *Pahlavans* (champions), *Khonyagars* (singers), celebrities, and icons as trans-temporal and inter-cultural legends, Khosrow Hassanzadeh has presented a series of portraits of Bollywood stars in his signature tilework style. While he considers these figures to be eternal icons, he believes them to be a fading phenomenon. Using tilework inspired by traditional manuscripts and imagery on the walls and domes of mosques and religious venues, he seeks to give special prominence to these figures and their image.

A poetic, vibrant, and often melancholic take on Persian calligraphy, Miniature painting, and popular 'Faal-e-Hafiz' divinations, Khosrow Hassanzadeh revisits his identity by writing down his memories as poems whose dancing lines fuse together to form a cursive script whose content remains an undisclosed secret. Using ink and pastel, materials dear to him since the earlier days of his artistic practice, and painting on large pieces of paper, a technique that goes back to his earliest works, Khosrow digs deeper into his past, seeking what he believes has been lost to him.



M. PRAVAT

Over the years, I have been looking at the most basic building block of all construction material, the brick. It is an element of architecture that provides stability. It becomes the foundation for all built structures. To even begin working with this material, I had to change my entire studio infrastructure. My work develops over a long period of time and with a number of helping hands, together with whom we rework this material.


Movement in Stillness is like a tapestry, and for me, it was an attempt to create a model or fragment of an ancient ruin. As I have been thinking about cityscapes and urban environments, I did not want to limit myself to modern or colonial cities. I am also interested in the deeper civilizational history of cities that continue to exist, sometimes buried underneath the cities we inhabit and sometimes visibly present and inhabited. Several ancient cities were built using fired bricks, and the field of archaeology is always trying to unearth them and remove the layers of dust that cover them. I feel that the medium of bricks, dust, paper, and ink push me to access these vast scales of time and history that we currently inhabit.

Continuing to work with the medium of brick and dust, Silver Stain plays with the fluidity of colours, light and textures to produce a blend between painting, sculpture and architecture. In these works, I want the viewer to experience painting through architecture and architecture through painting. To me, this series is going to be a homage to the history of stainedglass windows in cathedrals, modern constructivist paintings and early 20thcentury abstractionists such as Piet Mondrian and Joaquin Torres Garcia.




The Ambassadors, 2015 M. Pravat Cut Slate, Fired Bricks and Wood 122 cm x 244 cm (48 x 96")






Chromatic Musings features a selection of my recent works, whereby stitching, shaping and breaking fabric assume a bigger, bolder schema. Inspired by nature's abundance I embark upon a journey of introspection, evolution and selfactualisation. These works act as a meditative tool, delving deeper both literally and figuratively to uncover latent designs and thoughts.

We have an interesting way of training our senses, especially sight. From early experiments to push boundaries and develop experiences, we use our senses to glean a visual understanding of the world. By adulthood, these learnings morph into a library of sensory memories, emotions and impressions. My new works are full of explosions of saturated colour and rippling texture, inspired by my recent experiments and study of nature and its colour palette. By spontaneously rending and distressing the fabric, I create a sense of drama that draws in the viewer and intensifies their sensory reflections by drawing on stored memories.

Each panel is filled with unbridled joy, a celebration of the metamorphosis I see in nature, and an evolution in my practice. I offer new courage in the form of bold strokes and a spirited approach to the hues that bring the works to life.




Chromatic Musings #5, 2021 Vaishali Oak Fabric Assemblage 312.4 x 96.5 cm (123 x 38")






VIVEK VILASINI

Quarantine Suites comprises a collection of photographs that I took in hotel rooms and other spaces that I was constrained within, during the early days of the pandemic. This was amplified by the fact that I was in an alien land during much of the isolation, with the uncertainty of returning home, and the need to remain creative in that situation. To stabilize the circadian rhythm, turning off the lights with only the blinking LEDs of electronic devices, reinforces the strand of connection with the world outside. Takings these lights out for a walk à la Paul Klee, and drawing its registration within the confined space leads to realizing the meaning of 'Photography'.



Khosrow Hassanzadeh ARTIST BIOGRAPHY

Khosrow was born in a traditional working-class Iranian Azeri family who ran a fruit shop in Tehran. Working along his family members in the shop, he began drawing on packaging cardboard from a young age, a material he continues to use for drawing and painting, calling the practice "glamorizing" the worthless", and making large paintings on the neglected packaging carboard.

Starting in the early 2000s, "Pahlavans", the traditional Iranian wrestlers, became the focus of his work, a subject matter that Khosrow continued to work on for almost a




